The 2022 workshops were a great success with six schools welcoming the team to share the good news of Christmas to over 300 pupils. The most encouraging response throughout the two weeks occurred during the final workshop at Broomhill Primary. The pupils were

searching questions. The pupils wanted to know if Jesus had a surname?.. how we knew all that we knew about what the Bible says?...and is Christmas for everyone or is it just for those who are 'good' much like how Santa only gives gifts to children who behave well? As you can imagine, being able to share biblical answers to these questions was a joy particularly within a school environment. Karen Campbell, Team Leader of The Wheel Trust received excellent feedback from each of the six schools and most of them have already booked in for Easter Code workshops which will take place in March.

It was so encouraging to re-connect with the same team that worked so well together in summer.

At the end of January we welcomed Nate Morgan Locke of Speak Life who had travelled up from Eastbourne. Nate, challenged the 85 young people to shine like stars from Philippians 2:5-18. He encouraged the young people to see they have lots of opportunities to share the Good News of Jesus with the different people that they interact with in their lives. The Equip West team
