


Prayer Letter Glasgow

Open Bibles | SU Groups and Equip West

The SU Groups in Glasgow continue to be a space within our schools where followers of Jesus can join together within their school and be built up and at the same time the groups provide a space for those to discover what the Bible says about Jesus. I had the opportunity to share my favourite Bible verse from the New Testament (Romans 12:1–2) and my favourite Psalm (Psalm 8) with the pupils in Garrowhill SU Group. I was sharing part of my testimony and telling them as a follower of Jesus I have a story to share. I finished by challenging them to ask someone in their life who they know to be a follower of Jesus and ask them to share their story of how they came to know Jesus. Equip West events continue to be a highlight in my working calendar. As mentioned above it was fantastic to have Steve from SOLAS join us in April. In May we had SU Scotland's Prayer and Church Partnerships Co–ordinator, Elizabeth McDowall teach on 'Why Pray' which was the final event of Equip West for this academic year. We had 359 different young people attend an Equip West event in 2024/25. We pray they will be inspired to live for Jesus.

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Prayer Central and Volunteer First Approach | Local Ministry Hubs

One of my highlights this academic year has been attending the Bannerman High Local Ministry Hub and the Jordanhill Local Ministry Hub. These meetings are a time for local volunteers to gather and we simply use the time together to pray for the SU Groups that are up and running and to pray for new opportunities for school groups to begin. These times of focused prayer are so encouraging and uplifting as people share their stories and prayer points. If you'd liketo explore the possibility of forming a Local Ministry Hub in your area of the city, based around your local secondary school and feeder primary schools then I'd love to meet and chat more. As more and more of these volunteer groups start to meet then Glasgow will shine for Jesus across the schools and communities within the city.
